2. **Bloomington Housing Authority (HUD/BHA).** 1007 N. Summitt St; 339-3491. Subsidized housing for low income families, singles over 62, or disabled. Call for appointment. This federal agency also has limited funds for a "Section 8" program (*described under CAP*) that subsidizes rent in other housing. Waiting lists should be expected. Open Mon-Tue, Thu-Fri 8am-4pm; Wed 8am-12pm
3. **Middle Way House.** 404 West Kirkwood Ave; 336-0846. Free services for victims of domestic violence or sexual assault.
4. **Amethyst House.** 645 N Walnut St.; 336-2812. Short term residential homes (male & female) after treatment program. \$77/week.
5. **The Rise.** 401 S. Washington St; 337-4510. Apartments for women & children, especially abused women. 2 yr limit. Free child care. Associated with Middle Way House.
6. **Hanna House.** 808 N College Ave. ; 334-2662. For problem pregnancies.
7. **Youth Shelter.** Ages 10-17. 349-2507. Short term emergency care, free.
8. **Stepping Stones Inc.** 2615 East 2nd St; contact Sheri Benham 339-9771. Organization intended to help homeless ages 16-20 get new start with housing, job-counseling, etc.
9. **Housing Solutions, Inc.** 334-8385. Helps low-income families buy homes.
10. **Bloomington Department of Housing and Neighborhood Development. HAND program.** Ste. 401 N. Morton St., Suite 130, City Hall. 349-3401. Helps homeowners maintain their homes at no cost (if income requirements are met). May also provide rent deposits for those who attend required workshops.
